



OTHER ACTIVITIES YOU CAN DO AT HOME

1. Give your child jobs to do in the home and make sure they follow through with their responsibilities. Remember: you will have to teach your child how to do the job you want it completed. Don't expect him/her to know without first being taught.
2. Look through your child's papers when they come home. Review the things they did in school and praise the efforts your child has made to complete the work.
3. Your child's job is to be a learner and it sometimes a tough, low paying job for a three, four and five year old. Provide him/her with the tools needed to do a good job. Each child should have pencils, crayons, paper, and scissors at home. Also useful would be chalkboards and chalk (use old socks for erasers), magic slates, magnetic letters, puzzles, card games, (Fish, Old Maid, regular cards), checkers, Bingo, Candy Land, Chutes & Ladders, Memory, and Dominoes.
4. Talk to your child about everything. They are able to understand much more than we give them credit for and they are curious about everything. Talk to them about TV shows, the news, the weather, their friends, their feelings, EVERYTHING! Just talk!!!
